Learning postcards

If your child is in Year 1 – Year 6, they will be bringing home a Learning Postcard this week as a short piece of holiday Home Learning. We send these home each half-term, so that the children can have the opportunity to talk to you, or another member of the family, about what they have been learning about in their current History or Geography lessons. This short retrieval task helps consolidate the learning for the children and hopefully provides you with an insight into what they have been learning about. Please ask your child the question on the postcard and then write a little about what your child said in response to the question. The postcard will then be stuck in your child's Topic book. Thank you and we hope you enjoy hearing all about the topics!

Home reading

Learning to read is the most important thing your child will learn at our school. Everything else depends on it, so we put as much energy as we possibly can into making sure that every single child learns to read as quickly as possible. We want all children to **love** reading – and to want to read for themselves. This is why we put our efforts into making sure they develop a love of books as well as simply learning to read.

Our new elected Reading Ambassadors have been busy selecting their recommended "Book of the Month" and have shared these in assembly.

It is wonderful to see how many of our children are reading a range of texts at home, as well as at school. A key element to making progress in reading is building "reading miles". Children need to read as much and as widely as possible. This can be in the form of books, comics, newspapers, information leaflets, manuals etc. Reading in this way builds those reading miles and, as you can see below, a little bit of reading each day soon builds into thousands of words a year!

School Dinners

Dolce does not offer credit, and no longer has the option of paying by Direct Debit, so asks for all SchoolGrid accounts to be kept in credit at all times, by parents and staff. They do accommodate a three meal 'emergency' zone for incidents such as damaged or forgotten packed lunches, parents forgetting to top up their account etc. and a reminder email will be sent to parents from SchoolGrid to top the account up.

School will never allow a child to go without lunch, but if an account has not been topped up after this limit is reached the children are now being sent to the school office so that we can authorise the meal and pay for it. We will then ask parents to reimburse us for this via ParentPay.
