
Queensgate Primary School Home Learning

The children will have already been taught the sounds, tricky words and numbers below so this is an opportunity for them to consolidate and apply their learning. Can your child identify this number? Can they count out the correct number of objects? Can they count on and back from this number? Can they tell you what comes before or after this number on a number line? Can they find this number in the environment? What else can they tell you about this number? How many different ways can they find to make this total using two separate groups?
