Ongoing other writing activities:

 Use your Home Learning Journals to write about images from the brilliant website, Pobble365 <u>http://www.pobble365.com/</u>

This is a great site to practise writing as much as you like. I'd aim for one a week. But practise your proofreading, especially looking for spelling and punctuation errors. One activity I suggest doing with this, is one of our 'slow-write' paragraphs. You could choose 5 or 6 SPaG terms from your SPaG tag game or something from your CGP book contents page, and use them to include in your paragraph. For example,

- Sentence 1- must include a fronted adverbial of time/place/manner/frequency
- Sentence 2- must include a colon
- Sentence 3 must include the past-progressive tense
- Sentence 4 must include a work with the spelling rule 'ant/ance'
- Sentence 5 must include a subordinating conjunction
- Sentence 6 must include personification
