Can they spot the tricky words in books, stories online or in print in the environment?

### Literacy and Understanding the World

Linked of course to our zoo animals theme, this weeks task is based around Riddles. Have a look at the powerpoint in the blog entitled 'Zoo Animal Riddles' and see if you can work out which animals the clues are about. Your task is to then write a riddle of your own about a zoo animal of your choice. (Nursery you can get an adult to scribe for you). How do the riddle sentences start? (It's written in the first person, as if you're the animal yourself). What facts / clues about the animal could you share? See if someone can work out your riddle from your clues!



A second little task this week is just for fun. Can you create your own new hybrid zoo animal...?! It might have a tiger's body but zebra's legs and a parrot's head for example?! What would you call your new animal? What does it eat? What sound does it make? What does it like to do? We would love to see drawings or collages of your mixed up zoo animals! Even better if you can add labels or a description.


## English

epic! is an online library full of stories, non-fiction texts and audiobooks for the children to enjoy.

Click on the epic! image at the top of this page and it will take you to the website where you can log in as a student. You will be asked to enter our class code and then you can select your child's account and they can enjoy exploring the books available.

The children will not be assigned specific books based upon their reading level, rather I will assign all of the children a range of books each week based upon a theme. The children might be able to access some of the books themselves, you might need to read them to your child or I might assign audiobooks for them to listen to. This week our theme is **The Zoo!** 

Reception children will also continue to access RISING STARS as usual.
